Step 1: Complete the Local Scholarship Application either by using the fillable PDF online or by completing the paper application. Step 3 (on pages 14 - 16): Request Letters of Recommendation from teachers and community members/extra-curricular activities two weeks before the deadline. **Request by March 31, 2022**

Step 4 (on page 17) : Request a copy of your transcript one week before the deadline. The Transcript Request form is in the Local Scholarship Application. **Request by April 7, 2022.**

Step 5: Your completed application must be placed in binders with page protectors which will be provided by the Counseling Department. You will need 5 copies and one electronic copy of your complete scholarship application. If you are applying for fewer than 5 scholarships, then turn in the number of application notebooks corresponding to the number of scholarships. The Counseling Department will have work days during lunch and after school to help with your application.

Step 6: Turn in your completed application binders to the Counseling Department by **April 13, 2022 at 2:00 p.m. Late applications will be noted on the bottom of the application.**
