



Expectations For Dress - Dress For Success

Granite Falls High School is committed to providing a respectful learning environment for all students and staff. Students may express their individuality in their dress as long as their appearance does not cause a disruption to the educational process for themselves, other students, or staff. Students' choice in matters of dress and appearance shall be regulated when the sensibilities of others are impacted, in the judgment of school officials. The following expectations apply: Shorts and skirts must be mid-thigh or longer, shirts and tank tops must cover the stomach, back, and chest. Uncovered tube tops, spaghetti straps, halter tops, and tops with only one shoulder strap are not appropriate for school. Undergarments or clothing worn as undergarments must not be showing - this includes tank tops that are intended as undergarments. Clothing should not be "see-through". Clothing and accessories depicting the following should not be worn at school: promotion of drugs, alcohol, violence, racism, sexism, tobacco, use of profanity or associated innuendos, or displaying symbols or exhibiting behavior representing gang membership or affiliation. Students are encouraged to wear spirit clothing (black, orange, and white) every Friday. Students found to be in violation of the above policy, will be sent to the office and: 1. Be required to change clothing or go home (with guardian) 2. Subsequent offenses will be regarded as insubordination and will be handled according to guidelines in the policy handbook.

School Fees:

Students are encouraged to purchase an ASB Card. The money derived from the sale of ASB Cards helps fund student activities, such as athletics, clubs, and special events. An ASB Card entitles the purchaser to free admission to all home athletic events, and discounts to some activities (an ASB Card is required for all students participating in athletics and activities as well as qualify for campus parking).

Athletic Fees:

- Participation fees (\$60) must be paid after the selection of the teams and before the first contest.
- Refunds will be provided if an athlete quits due to illness or injury prior to the first interscholastic contest (medical documentation must be presented) or an athletic quits due to the family moving prior to the first interscholastic contest.
- No refunds will be approved for athletics who are dropped for athletic code violations or who do not meet grade requirements or who quit after the first interscholastic contest.
- Fees will not be prorated for students that join the season late.
- Fees or a request for a waiver for free/reduced lunch must be turned in to the athletic office.
- Scholarships are available. Contact the school principal for more information.

How to get cleared to play sports:

- All forms done online through the parent's side (Family 1) of Skyward Family Access (no paper forms. accepted). Online Registration opens 7/17/23
- Current physical exam (good for 2 years and cannot expire during the season).
- ASB Card \$45 (can be paid online in Skyward in Fee Management)
- All fines must be paid
- Get your name on the list at the Athletic Office
- Participation Fee (\$60) paid after the selection of the team and before the first contest
- Athletes must be covered with adequate health insurance or purchase school insurance.
- Athletes must be passing five full time subjects
- For non-traditional HS students additional form needed Academic Eligibility Stands Contract (see Athletic Office)
- Any Athlete who does not live with his/her own parent/guardian in the Granite Falls School District must get the Athletic Directors signature before he/she is permitted to turn out for any team. No exceptions. (You may be required to complete student eligibility packet)
- New Students must meet with the Athletic Director to determine eligibility

National School Lunch Program/School Breakfast Program 2023-24 Letter to Households (Public Schools)

What must be on the application?

A. For households not getting any assistance:

- Student name(s)
- Names of all household members
- · Income by source for all household members
- · Adult household member's signature
- Last 4 digits of social security number of the adult household member who signs the application (or if the adult signing does not have a social security number, check the associated box).

Complete Parts 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5; Part 6 is optional.

B. For households with only foster child(ren)

- Student's name
- · Adult household member signature

Complete *Parts 1* and *5*; *Part 6* is optional. You may also send the school a copy of the court documentation showing the foster child(ren) was/were placed with you instead of filling out an application form.

Last 4 digits of SSN are not required for B.

What must be on the application? continued

C. For a family getting Basic Food/TANF/FDPIR:

- · List all student names
- Enter a case number
- Adult household member's signature Complete *Parts 1, 2, 4,* and *5. Part 6* is optional.

Last 4 digits of SSN are not required for C.

D. For household with a foster child(ren) and other children:

Apply as a household and include foster children. Follow the directions for "A. For households not getting any assistance:" and include the foster child's personal use income.

What if I'm not receiving basic food dollars?

If you have been approved for Basic Food but do not actually receive Basic Food dollars, you may be eligible for free or reduced-price meals. You must apply for meal benefits by filling out a meal application and returning it to your child's school.

Do my children automatically qualify if they have a case number?

Yes. Children on TANF or Basic Food may get free meals and children receiving some Medicaid benefits may be eligible for free or reduced-price meals without the household having to complete an application. These children are identified by the school using a data matching process. This matched list is then made available to your child's school food service staff. The students on this list get free meals if their schools have the free and reduced-price breakfast and/or lunch program (not all schools do). Please contact us immediately if you feel your children should be receiving free meals and are not. If you do not want your child to participate in the free meal programs using this method, please notify the school.

If anyone in my household has a case number, will all children qualify for free meals?

Yes. If someone else in the household has a case number, other than a foster child, you must fill out an application and send it to your student's school. Please contact us immediately if you feel other children in your household should be receiving free meals and are not.

Basic Food - Can I qualify for assistance in buying food?

Basic Food is the state's food stamp program. It helps households make ends meet by providing monthly benefits to buy food. Getting Basic Food is easy! You can apply in person at the local DSHS Community Service Office, by mail, or online. There are other benefits too. You can learn about Basic Food by calling 1-877-501-2233 or by logging on to https://www.dshs.wa.gov/esa/community-services-offices/basic-food.

We are in the military. Do we report our income differently?

Your basic pay and cash bonuses must be reported as income. If you get any cash value allowances for off-base housing, food, or clothing, it must also be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. Any additional combat pay resulting from deployment is also excluded from income.

My child's application was approved last year. Do I need to fill out a new one?

Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year.

What if some household members have no income to report?

Household members may not receive some types of income we ask you to report on the application, or may not receive income at all. Whenever this happens, please write a 0 in the field. However, if any income fields are left empty or blank, those will <u>also</u> be counted as zeroes. Please be careful when leaving income fields blank, as we will assume you <u>meant</u> to do so.

What if my child needs special foods?

If your child needs special foods, contact the school/district food service office.

Proof of Eligibility

The information you provide may be verified at any time. You may be asked to send additional information to prove your child is eligible to receive free and reduced-price meals.

Fair Hearing

If you do not agree with the decision on your child's application or the process used to prove income eligibility, you may talk with Marshall Kruse, the fair hearing official. You have the right to a fair hearing which may be arranged by calling the school/school district at this number 360.691.7713.

Reapplication

You may apply for benefits any time during the school year. If you should have a decrease in household income, an increase in household size, or become unemployed, or receive Basic Food, TANF, or FDPIR, you may be eligible for benefits and may fill out an application at that time.

HOMELESS AND/OR DISPLACED CHILDREN AND YOUTH

If you lost your housing and now live in a shelter, motel, vehicle, camping ground, or temporary trailer; on the street; doubled-up with family or friends; or in another type of temporary or inadequate housing, your child might be able to receive help through a federal law called the McKinney-Vento Act. Under the McKinney-Vento Act, children in transitional situations have the right to:

- Attend either the local school or the school of origin, if this is in their best interest; the school of origin is the school the child attended when he/she was permanently housed or the school in which the child was last enrolled.
- Receive transportation to and from the school of origin.
- Enroll in school immediately, even if missing records and documents normally required for enrollment, such as a birth certificate, proof of residence, previous school records, or immunization/medical records.

Homeless, or displaced, students will be provided district services for which they are eligible. Parents or students should contact the Student Services Department at 360.691.7717 for full information.

CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE)

The Granite Falls School District offers classes in many career and technical education program areas including Business Education, Computer Information Technology, Agriculture Science and Manufacturing Technology and Industry under its open admissions policy. Lack of English language proficiency will not be a barrier to admission and participation in career and technical education programs. EMERGENCY/INCLEMENT WEATHER COMMUNICATION:

Parents will also be notified of a closure/delay through the phone messaging School Messenger system, District Facebook page, & posted on the SR92 Electronic Reader Sign.

FOOD ALLERGIES/FOOD BROUGHT TO SCHOOL BY STUDENTS/PARENTS

Food allergies can be a life-threatening situation. We have several students at our school who have life-threatening food allergies including cinnamon, walnuts, pecans, and peanuts. School staff have been trained to recognize such a reaction and to administer medication (epinephrine) in an emergency. You can help staff and the school by taking advantage of opportunities to learn more about food allergies and by helping your child understand the foods they freely enjoy can be dangerous to others. Guidelines for Food Served at Room Parties or Brought to School by Students/Parents—Many schools have classroom parties for the holidays or other occasions that include refreshments. In addition, students may often bring treats from home to celebrate a birthday or other special day. REPORT TO THE COMMUNITY – Granite Falls School District <u>Policy 3232</u> outlines information related to parent/student rights in administration of surveys, analysis or evaluations in accordance with the Federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).

Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), formerly Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) legislation, requires school districts to annually report on progress outlining specific information and include state assessment results. The Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) has compiled all the data from all schools in the State of Washington. The reports include:

- State Assessment Test Scores (Smarter Balanced, MSP/HSPE, EOC, WA-AIM & WaKIDS)
- Student Demographic Information
- Staff Information

HARASSMENT, INTIMIDATION, & BULLYING (HIB)

The Granite Falls School District recognizes that bullying is a widespread and persistent problem that can happen anywhere despite education and prevention efforts. We ask you to partner with us to address this problem and to ensure that our schools are safe and positive places for growing and learning.

It is the policy of the Granite Falls School District to be committed to maintaining a safe and civil educational environment for all students, staff or others involved in School District programs or activities free from harassment, intimidation, and bullying. Individuals will not be harassed because of their race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, including gender expression or identity, mental or physical disability, or other distinguishing characteristics. This means any image or message (written or electronically transmitted), verbal or physical act that is intended to harm or intimidate and has the effect to physically harm a student or substantially interfere with a student's education or create an intimidating or threatening educational environment, or substantially disrupts the orderly operation of the school. Harassment, intimidation, and bullying in any form are unacceptable and are against District policy and state and federal law. Students who engage in such activity on school grounds or off campus, and disrupts school

operations or the learning environment, shall be subject to school disciplinary action and possible criminal prosecution. Any student who believes he or she has been the target of harassment, intimidation, or bullying is strongly encouraged to report incidents verbally or in writing to a parent, guardian, staff member or a trusted adult. The student, parent, or other adult, should notify school officials as soon as possible and complete an incident report form- these forms can be found on the District website. Students and staff are protected against sexual harassment by anyone in any school program or activity, including on school campus, on the school bus, or off campus at a school sponsored activity.

DEALING WITH DANGEROUS WILDLIFE

It is always a good time to review safety tips with your children if they should encounter wildlife in the area:

- Stop, don't run. Pick up small children so they will not run. Stay calm and avoid direct eye contact.
- Never approach the animal but do not take your eyes off the animal or turn your back.
- If you cannot safely move away, try to appear larger than the animal. Do not crouch down or try to hide.
- If the animal displays aggressive behavior, shout, clap your hands, wave your arms or throw rocks.
- If the animal attacks, fight back and try to stay on your feet, do NOT play dead, do NOT run and climb a tree.
- If a bear attack continues, as a last resort, protect yourself by curling into a ball or lying on your stomach and playing dead.

Please tell your child to be alert for any wildlife while waiting for the bus or walking home from bus stops or out in the backyard playing. The <u>Department of Fish and Wildlife</u> has developed information specific to dangerous wildlife and what to do, and not do if you encounter wildlife. Report wildlife encounters to the Department of Fish and Wildlife during regular business hours call 425.775.1311 or after hours call 911. If you site wildlife in the area--near the schools or bus stops-- please contact the Superintendent's Office at 360.691.7717. Remember to note the location, time, and date of the sighting for reporting.

ERVICES FOR HIGHLY CAPABLE STUDENTS

Highly capable students are students who perform or show potential for performing at significantly advanced academic levels when compared with others of their age, experiences, or environments.

Students may be referred by parents, peers and members of the community to qualify for the District's Highly Capable program. Those referring will complete a behavioral characteristics questionnaire and teachers will provide information that includes classroom performance and general achievement levels. The District will screen each of those referred using reading, cognitive and math measures to identify students who qualify for further assessment. Prior to conducting the assessment, the principal or designee shall obtain written parental permission. Referrals identified through the screening process will be assessed using multiple criteria from a variety of sources and data, including tests that measure cognitive ability, academic achievement and evidence of exceptional creativity. Test results shall be recorded in the student's cumulative file.

The students selected for participation in the program will be determined by a multidisciplinary committee which includes a classroom teacher or if possible, a highly capable teacher, the program director, a psychologist or other individual who can interpret cognitive and achievement test results, and other professionals as deemed desirable. The multidisciplinary committee will review data of nominated students. They will select those students who meet the criteria and would benefit the most from the program. The District will:

- 1. Notify the parents of those students who have been selected. Parents shall receive a full explanation of the procedures for identification, program options and the appeal process.
- 2. Obtain parental permission to place identified students in the program before any special services programs are provided to student.
